A Public-Private Coordinated Response Towards Effective Management of AES in Eastern Uttar Pradesh

19-August-2018 Venue-Railway Officers Club, Near GM Office NE Railway, Railway stadium Colony, GORAKHPUR UP Timings-1:00 PM – 5:00 PM

Uttar Pradesh being the largest state of India with over 200 million population accounts for the largest number of cases of AES/JE in the country. In order to ensure effective management of AES, it is necessary to strengthen the engagement of public and private sector health care providers and health facilities to help in early identification, management and timely referrals of AES. MAMTA-HIMC in collaboration with PATH is working towards establishing a common platform bringing all the high level stakeholders (public as well as private sector) together to facilitate a coordinated response.

The intentof this meeting is to seek high level commitment and support of all the stakeholders at the state/district level including National Vector Borne Disease Control Program (NVBDCP), Commissioners, Chief Medical and Health Officers (CMHO) of the Gorakhpur and Basti Districts, Indian Medical Association (IMA), Indian Academy of Pediatrics (IAP)and public health experts from the Medical colleges (IndianPublic Health Association (IPHA)/Indian Association of Preventive and Social Medicine (IAPSM)) for developing roles and responsibilities for the effective engagement of private sector health care providers in the AES management.

Key objectives:

- 1. To bring public and private partners on a common platform to seek commitment of State's response on AES/JE
- 2. To provide the most updated knowledge on AES/JE in terms of aetiology, diagnostics and management supported by scientific evidence as well as state's preparedness for the same.
- 3. To develop collaborative pathway for strengthening private sector engagement in reducing morbidity and mortality in children under 15 years of age.

Strategy:

- 1. Get highest of political and bureaucratic leadership to interact with professional bodies (IMA, IAP, IPHA, IAPSM)
- 2. Expert's talk, listen and decide the way forward on various aspects of AES/JE management
- 3. Organise an interactive session for understanding concerns from private practitioners and take their key recommendations for addressing the same.
